CROCHET SYMBOLS & ABBBEVIATIONS



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LEFT ARM:

First, let's make the fingers.

1.) ch 5, sl. st in the second ch from book and in remaining 3 ch, ch 6, sl. st. in the second ch from book and in remaining 4 ch, ch 5, sl. st. in the second ch from book and in remaining 3 ch, ch 4, sl. st. in second ch from book and in remaining 2 ch.

ARMS

2.) ch 1, make 1 sc in the bottom of each finger.





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5.) 7 sc, ch 5, sl. st. in the second ch from hook and in remaining 3 ch, sc in the last sc in hand. We just made a thumb.
6.-7.) 8 sc



8.) dec, 6 sc (7 sc) 9.-11.) 7 sc 12.) inc, 6 sc (8 sc) 13.-15.) 8 sc 16.) inc, 7 sc (9 sc) 17.-19.) 9 sc 20.) inc, 8 sc (10 sc) 21.-23.) 10 sc 24.) inc, 9 sc (11 sc) 25.) 11 sc [stuff lightly] 26.) dec, 9 sc (10 sc) 27.) 10 sc

Insert the wire (approximately 15 cm long) and start lightly stuffing the arm, right until the end. 28.) inc, 9 sc (11 sc) 29.) 11 sc 30.) inc, 10 sc (12 sc) 31.-36.) 12 sc Fasten off.





Again, starting with the fingers.

1.) ch 4, sl. st. in second ch from hook and in remaining 2 ch, ch 5, sl. st in the second ch from hook and in remaining 3 ch, ch 6, sl. st. in the second ch from hook and in remaining 4 ch, ch 5, sl. st. in the second ch from book and in remaining 3 ch. 2.) ch 1, make 1 sc in the bottom of each finger. 3.) ch 1, turn work, make 4 sc in F.L.O make 4 sc in B.LO. (8sc) 4.) 8 sc 5.) 5 sc, ch 5, sl. st. in the second ch from hook and in remaining 3 ch, sc in the last 3 sc in hand. 6.-7.) 8 sc 8.) 6 sc, dec (7 sc) 9.-11.) 7 sc 12.) 6 sc, inc (8 sc) 13.-15.) 8 sc 16.) 7 sc, inc (9 sc) 17.-19.) (9 sc) 20.) 8 sc, inc (10 sc) 21.-23.) 10 sc 24.) 9 sc, inc (11 sc) 25.) 11 SC 26.) 9 sc, dec (10 sc) 27.) 10 SC **Insert the wire and start lightly stuffing the arm, right until the end.** 28.) 9 sc, inc (11 sc) 29.) 11 SC 30.) 10 sc, inc (12 sc) 31.-36.) 12 sc Stuff and fasten off.

LEFT LEG:

1.) ch 5, make sc in the second ch from hook. Do sc in 3 remaining chains. Now turn your work sideways and work one sc in each chain on the other side of the beggining chains. You should now have 8 sc around.

2.) Inc, 2 sc, 2 inc, 2 sc, inc (12 sc)

3.-9.) 12SC

10.) 3 sc, 3 inc, 6 sc (15 sc)

11.-12.) 15 sc

13.) 4 sc, 3 dec, 5 sc (12 sc)

14.) 2 sc, 3 dec, 4 sc (9 sc)

Cut the wire approximately 28 centimeters long. Make a loop at the end and tape it together, to secure it. Insert the wire into the foot and tightly stuff only the heel.



15.-23.) 9 sc 24.) 4 sc, inc, 4 sc (10 sc) 25.-26.) 10 sc **27.)** 5 sc, inc, 4 sc (11 sc) 28.-29.) 11 sc **30.) 5 sc**, **inc**, **sc**, **inc**, **3 sc** (**13 sc**) 31.-33.) 13 sc 34.) 5 sc, inc, 2sc, inc, 4 sc (15 sc) 35.-37.) 15 SC 38.) 7 sc, inc, 3 sc, inc, 3 sc (17 sc) 39.-40.) 17 sc 41.) 10 sc, dec, 5 sc (16 sc) 42.) 9 sc, dec, 5 sc (15 sc) 43.) 9 sc, dec, 4 (14 sc) Keep stuffing while crocheting. 44.) 9 sc, dec, 3 sc (13 sc) 45.) 8 sc, dec, 3 sc (12 sc) 46.) 3 inc (F.L.O.), 9 sc (15 sc) 47.-48.) 15 sc 49.) 2 sc, 2 dec, 4 sc, 2 inc, 3 sc (15 sc) 50.) 15 SC Tightly stuff the knee. 51.) 10 sc, inc, 4 sc (16 sc) 52.) 16 sc 53.) 10 sc, inc, 2 sc, inc, 2 sc (18 sc) 54.) 18 sc

55.) 10 sc, inc, 3 sc, inc, 3 sc (20 sc)

56.) 20 SC





Stuff and fasten off. You can shape the legs however you'd like. For toes, i use flat nose pliers, to bend the wire into shape.

UNSHAPED





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Repeat the pattern for the left leg, <u>**BUT do NOT**</u> fasten off! We will be joining legs now.



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JOINING LEGS

73.) Continuing to crochet in the right leg, we are going to make: 14 sc into right leg, ch 2, joining with left leg in the second sc from where you fastened off the leg and make 32 sc, ch 2 and finish the joining round with 18 sc in the right leg. (You should now have 64 sc and two ch 2 spaces).



74.) 14 sc, 2 sc in ch 2 space, 32 sc, 2 sc in ch 2 space, 18 sc. (68 sc)



Bend the wire like shown in the photo and tape it together to secure it.



75.-76.) 68 sc 77.) 42 sc, skip 14 sc, 12 sc (54 sc) 78.) 40 sc, 2 dec, 10 sc (52 sc) 79.) 38 sc, 4 dec, 6 sc (48sc) 80.) 36 sc, 4 dec, 4 sc (44 sc) 81.) 34 sc, 4 dec, 2 sc (40 sc) 82.) 32 sc, 4 dec (36 sc) 83.) 28 sc, 4 dec (32 sc) 84.-85.) 32 sc

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Tightly stuff top of the legs. Also stuff the booty and shape it.



86.) inc, 30, inc (34 sc)
87.) sc, inc, 30 sc, inc, sc (36 sc)
88.) 2 sc, inc, 30 sc, inc, 2 sc (38 sc)
89.-93.) 38 sc
94.) 3 sc, inc, 30 sc, inc, 3 sc (40 sc)
95.-96.) 40 sc

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JOINING ARMS

97.) Continue from where you ended the pattern for joining the leg. Make 8 sc, ch 1, now join in the 8th sc of the right arm and make 10 sc in the arm, skip the remaining 2 sc from the arm and ch 1, skip another 2 sc from the body and make 20 sc, ch 1, now join in the 5th sc of the left arm and make 10 sc into the arm, skip the remaining 2 sc from the arm and ch 1, skip another 2 sc from the body and make 8 sc. (56 sc and 4 ch 1 spaces). Bend the wires and tape them all together.



98.) Do sc around including 1 sc in each ch 1 space. (60 sc)
99.) 10 sc, 4 dec, 24 sc, 4 dec, 10 sc (52 sc)
100.) 9 sc, 4 dec, 18 sc, 4 dec, 9 sc (44 sc)
101.) 7 sc, 3 dec, 18 sc, 3 dec, 7 sc (38 sc)
102.) 5 sc, 3 dec, 16 sc, 3 dec, 5 sc (32 sc)
103.) 3 sc, 3 dec, 14 sc, 3 dec, 3 sc (26 sc)
Stuff and continue stuffing while crocheting.

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Fasten off. Thread the needle with the same cotton you used for the body and sew the armpits and the space between the legs shut. At this time you can also sew on the belly button.



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1.) 6 sc in MR (6 sc) 2.) 6 inc (12 sc) 3.) (sc, inc) x 6 (18 sc) 4.) (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24 sc) 5.) (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30 sc) 6.) (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36 sc) 7.) (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42 sc) 8.-13.) 42 sc 14.) (5 sc, dec) x 6 (36 sc) 15.-16.) 36 sc Mark 8th and 29th sc in round 16. That marks the top of the ears. 17.) 10 sc, (inc, sc, inc) B.L.O, 10 sc, (inc, sc, inc) B.L.O, 10 sc (40 sc) 18.) 40 sc Mark 8th and 33rd sc in round 18. That marks the bottom of the

HEAD



ears.

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IN ROW 19, WE MAKE A NOSE. IF YOU WOULD LIKE IT TO BE SMALLER, YOU CAN INSTEAD MAKE (2 SC IN ONE SC) X 2 AND THEN (SC2TOG)) X 2 IN ROW 20

DEFINING THE NOSE BRIDGE

Insert the needle through the bottom of the head and make it exit next to the bottom of the nose, like shown in the picture.



Now insert the needle into the sc above the sc you just exited from and exit 3 sc left of the nose.





Now insert the needle into the sc above the sc you just exited from and exit 3 sc right of the nose.



Repeat these steps for 3 more rows, lightly tugging on the thread each time, to pull the stitches closer to form the nose bridge. Repeat all the steps back down to the nose and exit through the sc left of the bottom of the nose, through to the bottom of the head and fasten off.





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NECK OPENING

You can skip this step, if you don't mind the stuffing peeking through the neck opening. It won't be visible when you will place the head on to the body (neck).

1.) Join your thread in the opening you made in the back of the head. It doesn't matter where you start. Make

10 sc around.



2.-8.) (10 sc)9.) sl. st. in every other sc to close.





Fasten off and use the tweezers to push the neck opening inside the head. This is where you will insert the neck.



RIGHT EAR:

Join your thread in the bottom sc you marked (33rd sc of row
 The face should be facing away from you.
 and sl, st in the top sc you marked (20th sc in row 16)

EARS

Ch 3, and sl. st in the top sc you marked (29th sc in row 16).

Ch 1, turn work



2.) You are now facing the face of the doll. Working in the ch 3 space, make: hdc, dc, tr, 2 dc, hdc, sc, sl. st.

Fasten off and weave in the ends.



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LEFT EAR:

1.) Join your thread in the top sc you marked (8th sc in row 16). The face should be facing awayfrom you. Ch 3, and sl. st in the bottom sc you marked (8th sc in row 18). Ch 1, turn work.



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2.) You are now facing the face of the doll. Working in the ch 3 space, make: sc, hdc, 2 dc, tr, dc, hdc, sl. st. Fasten off and weave in the ends.







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3 sc in MR (3 sc)
 3 inc in B.L.O (6 sc)
 6 inc (12 sc)
 (sc, inc) x 6 (18 sc)
 (18 sc)



make two

IF YOU WISH TO MAKE THE BREASTS SMALLER, YOU CAN FINISH INCREASING WITH ROUND 3 AND MAKE 2 MORE ROUNDS OF 12 SC.

Make 2. Fasten off, leaving long tail of thread for attaching the breasts to the body. Sew them on the body, leaving small opening and stuff them. Finish off sewing them on to the doll.



YOU ARE DONE!

You can now blush the body with some soft pastels (optional), dress her up however you'd like and make her completely your own and unique!



THOUGHTS & THANKS

I hope you liked this pattern and hopefully it was easy to follow. Like i said before, english is not my native language, so some instructions may be harder to understand or maybe i'm just bad at explaining haha! But i will gladly try and better explain any questions you might have.
